New Student Orientation

Preparation for the 2004-2005 academic year has already begun at Texas State University, with the first of several New Student Orientations beginning Thursday, June 3. Orientation dates continue from June 14-19, 21-25, 28-30 and July 1-2, with dates continuing into July.

Sessions are two days for incoming freshman students and one day for transfer students.

The University estimates about 5,500 students will attend, while freshmen must stay in dorms, half attend with parents. Parents and transfer students will be staying in local hotels.

Texas State Summer Camps

Texas State University hosts a variety of summer camps for junior high and high school students every year. All of these camps, academic, athletic and artistic, begin this month.

While the student participants will stay in dorms on campus, the parents may choose to stay overnight in the city upon dropping off or picking up students.

Additionally, band camps have performances on June 11, 18, 25 to which parents and families are invited. The UCA cheer camps also have performances June 4, 7, 13, 18 and 24 for families.

The 24th annual local celebration has grown into a community-wide effort with corporate sponsors for the day's activities, making this event to be free to the public.

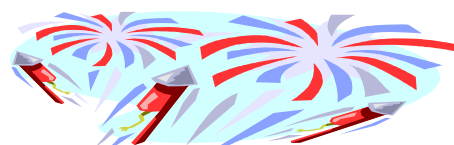
The day will be filled with continuous live entertainment, food and activities for all ages.
